

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



## Alan

Here is a more considered version . The 'church 'seating is reduced to a block of 12 x 4 + central aisle. 48. The diagonal dotted line from the front

indicates that it is equidistant from either wall with a .5cm variation only. The main block behind is made up of 120 seats and the

remaining to the right of the entry make up 32 - ergo 200 ! Re these seats the diagonal line from the front left crossed seat to the back wall

with the black arrow head indicates the sightline clearance across the upstage/ front end seat of the church seating so, that long wall could be

used to within 2 metres of the arched recess.

Re the church seating as the sight line from the corner seats is so good it could be raked but then we would have to put the main block of seats on


risers whatever type of seats they were. Also the church seats placed centrally in the space ( but not in relation to the main block ) makes a bigger

impact in relation to the environmental design I feel. I did move it up to be central with the seating block and it looked very odd and unbalanced.

Still a model will prove what works or not. Your thoughts?
